

# Finding Italy in Richmond

From the best Italian restaurants and most popular festivals to cultural events and authentic markets, Italy's influences are everywhere in America. In this NIAF on Location, John Corritone offers his advice for finding Italy in Richmond, Va., where he is the corresponding secretary and a past president of the Italian-American Cultural Association of Virginia (IACA).



In my 39 years living in Richmond, I have seen many changes. Growing up on Long Island, then living 10 years in the Detroit area, I was used to many Italian influenced towns and neighborhoods. Arriving in Richmond in 1984, I was surprised to see so few Italian Americans living here and so few Italian restaurants. But over the years, the influx Italian Americans from Northeast and Midwest brought the love of Italian culture and heritage, and authentic Italian restaurants.

#### What are the most Italian parts of Richmond?

In the 1920s, Highland Park became Richmond's vibrant Italian community, populated by immigrants, many of them stonemasons and artisans from Tuscany whose decorative stonework still decorates iconic buildings in downtown Richmond today. After World War II, many resettled in the Richmond suburbs for better employment, schools and quality of life, leaving no distinct Italian neighborhood. In 2017, a state historical marker was unveiled in Highland Park recognizing their accomplishments.

## What are your favorite Italian restaurants in Richmond

To ask my favorite Italian restaurants is like asking who my favorite child is. Two sites that stand out are Chianti's and Casa Italiano, both located in Richmond's West End. Chianti's has a family feel the moment you walk in, similar to Sunday dinner at Nonna's. Casa Italiano is more contemporary, with an upscale vibe, and serves an eclectic menu. The Shrimp Francese over Pasta from Chianti's and the Pappardelle with Sausage Ragu at Casa Italiano are to die for!

# Are there any 'back in time" Italian-neighborhood restaurants there?

When Richmonders want an authentic Italian neighborhood restaurant, they visit Edo's Squid in the Fan District. Edo's Squid is steps from the urban campus of Virginia Commonwealth University — an area that could pass as an Italian neighborhood from earlier times. Once inside this rowhouse restaurant, aromas of garlic, tomatoes and seafood along with the informal energy take you back in time. Owner Ed Vasairo is in and out of the small, open-air kitchen. Don't be surprised if he pulls up a chair to talk. Favorite dishes: broccoletti di rappa, scungilli insalata, shrimp fra diavolo and squid napoletana.

#### How about Italian fashion?

Franco's Fine Clothier, located at the Short Pump Town Center in the West End and at its original location in Northside, is one of Virginia's finest haberdashers. Now in its second generation of ownership, the Franco family and its founder, Franco Ambrogi, who emigrated from Tuscany in 1955, have earned a 50-year reputation for exceptional craftsmanship and outstanding service.

#### Where to go for Italian Culture?

The Richmond Symphony includes Italian operas throughout the year—selections from Verdi, Puccini, and Rossini, among them. The Italian Gardens at Maymont Park feature exquisite stonework, statuary and fountains that, since 1910, have displayed classical Italian style from the 15th and 16th centuries. The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts offers an excellent collection of Italian art and sculpture.

#### What's the most Italian Day in your community?

In past years, Columbus Day in Richmond was celebrated on the 2nd Sunday in

October at the Columbus Monument (since 1927). Regrettably, the Columbus statue was illegally taken down and vandalized during the 2020 protests. The Italian American community, notably the IACA, has repaired and restored the statue with intent to re-install it in a safe, permanent location in Richmond where it can be appreciated as art and restore the legacy of Christopher Columbus.

#### Where's the best morning espresso?

Caffespresso, owned by Claudio Ragazzi, located in the West End of Richmond, is by far the best cafe to start your day with an espresso.

# Is there an organization there that promotes Italian-American culture?

The IACA, founded in 1984, unites Italian Americans and anyone interested in the rich Italian heritage and culture. Members connect with passion to perpetuate and promote Italian culture for current and future generations. The organization provides three yearly scholarships to deserving students and hosts a yearly fundraiser.
